### 4. The council's political structure

Philip Woodward (Executive Director) provided an overview of the information gathering exercises undertaken by Members on the various political structures open to the Council.

At the meeting on the on the 26<sup>th</sup> of July Members heard from a range of sources including;

- Councillor J Coombes (Leader of FBC)
- George Buckley IDeA Member Peer (Conservative)
- Keith Whaley IDeA Member Peer (Independent)
- (Deputy) Chief Exec (evidence on officer support)

It was agreed at the meeting that further information was required before members could form a balanced and informed view on any possible structure changes to the Council. To aid them in their understanding the following information and actions were requested;

- Arrange a visit to South Ribble - this was arranged to take place on the 7<sup>th</sup> of September in order for members of the Forum to witness South Ribble's Cabinet in action.
- Second meeting with broader evidence including opposition councillors from a Council operating a Cabinet system (Wyre B C) and the Leader and Chief Executive of a council operating the multi-policy committees under the "fourth option (Ribble Valley). This meeting was held on the 24<sup>th</sup> of August.
- A paper exercise consisting of about a dozen different political structures - this was completed and circulated to relevant Councillors as part of the paperwork for the meeting on the 24<sup>th</sup> August.

Information had now been taken from a wide range of sources to help inform Members' decisions on the best way forward for Fylde BC.

Members of the Forum now needed to draw together and condense this information into proposals and recommendations to put to the Special Council meeting planned for the 26<sup>th</sup> September.

A full and detailed debate took place at which Members expressed their views on the pros and cons of alternative political structures, namely, moving towards a cabinet system or reverting back to a streamlined committee system.

Following full consideration Members RESOLVED

1. That the Notice of Motion to go back to the Policy Committee structure is not upheld on the grounds that the evidence gathered did not support this action.
2. That the Forum recommends to the Full Council that the authority move towards an executive system on the leader and cabinet model.
3. The new system of governance should include area committees covering the whole district
4. That consultation required to move to a such a system is begun at the earliest opportunity.
5. Revise the constitution to reflect the principles set out in the report for discussion at a future meeting of the forum and adoption by a future meeting of the council
