

## **Decision Notice**

Date 29 January 2010

Applicant 2 Pleasant Street, Lytham

Reason for Hearing The Licensing Authority has received an application for the grant

of a Premises Licence at 2 Pleasant Street, Lytham

There has been a representation from the Fire Service, a responsible authority under the Act and from persons living in

the vicinity of the premises.

The Licensing Authority has received an application for the grant of the premises licence at 2 Pleasant Street, Lytham.

Representations have been received to the application for a licence from 2 interested parties and one responsible authority, the Fire Service.

In considering the application before us today, we have to consider the four licensing objectives which are:

- The prevention of crime and disorder;
- Public safety;
- The prevention of public nuisance; and
- The protection of children from harm.

## **DECISION**

Taking into account the Information put before us, the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 we have decided as follows:

To grant the licence subject to the conditions specified in the operating schedule, the additional conditions agreed between the applicant and Police and Environmental Protection department, and the removal of the seasonal variations as agreed with the Planning Office.

It is noted that the application has undertaken to address the concerns of the Fire Service and the Fire Service have withdrawn their representation.

The concerns of Mr Jameson, one of the interested parties, make reference to the use of the premises under the previous owners when being operated under a Temporary Event Notice. As the Licensing Authority we are unable to attach conditions to a premises licence restricting the use of Temporary Events - in doing so we would be acting *ultra vires*. However, we urge Mr and Mrs Staals to note and consider the concerns of the residents when operating late at night.
