## PUBLCITEM

This item is for consideration in the public part of the meeting.

## SUM MARY

The council is required annually to confirm the committees that it wishes to appoint and allocate the membership of certain committees in accordance with the principles of political balance under the Local Government and Housing Act 1989.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Appoint the committees and joint committees set out in appendix 1 for the municipal year 2023-2024, with the same terms of reference as presently agreed.
2. Allocate committee seats in accordance with the principles of political balance as set out in the table in paragraph 7.
3. Appoint members to seats on committees required to be politically balanced in accordance with the nominations made by the political groups, as set out in appendix 2 .
4. Appoint Mr Peter Clements, Mr Brian Horrocks and M rs Helen Broughton as co-opted members of the Chief Officer Employment Committee and appoint Fylde's representative to the Blackpool, Fylde and Wyre Economic Prosperity Board.
5. Appoint members to the Licensing Committee, which is not required to be politically balanced.
6. Formally discontinue the Member Development Steering Group.

## SUM M ARY OF PREVIOUS DECISIONS

The council receives a similar report each year at the meeting preceding its annual meeting. In an election year, the report must be presented to the annual meeting.

## REPORT

## APPOINTM ENT OF COM M ITTEES

1. Under its constitution, the council is required annually to decide which committees to establish for the municipal year; decide the size and terms of reference for those committees; and decide the allocation of seats on those committees to political groups in accordance with the political balance rules where applicable.
2. Appendix 1 sets out the proposed committees for the council for 2023-24. The proposed committees reflect the new constitution agreed at the council meeting on 6 February, and which took effect on 9 M ay. The council is invited to appoint those committees as its committees for the municipal year 2023-24 with the size as set out and the terms of reference as set out in the constitution.

## POLITICAL BALANCE

3. The Local Government and Housing Act 1989 requires the council to calculate the membership of committees in accordance with the requirements of political balance set out in the act. The act also requires that the council give effect to those calculations by allocating seats in accordance with the wishes of the political groups ${ }^{1}$ to whom the seats have been allocated ${ }^{2}$. The four principles of political balance can be summarised like this:

- All seats on a committee must not be allocated to the same group;
- The majority group must have the majority of seats on each committee;
- The total number of committee seats across the council must be allocated proportionately to the number of seats each group has on the full council; and
- The seats on each committee must be allocated in proportion to the number of seats of each group on the full council.

4. The four principles are in order of priority. This means that the second principle is applied subject to the first. Similarly, the third principle is applied subject to the first and the second, and so on.
5. The council must appoint ${ }^{3}$ at least two co-opted members to its Chief Officer Employment Committee. The coopted members must be drawn from the independent persons appointed as part of the member standards machinery under the Localism Act 2011. The independent persons only sit as members of the committee for certain business taken under specific legislation ${ }^{4}$.
6. Neither the Licensing Committee ${ }^{5}$ nor the Blackpool, Fylde and Wyre Economic Prosperity Board ${ }^{6}$ is subject to the political balance rules.
7. The table below sets out a distribution of seats across committees, which fulfils the requirement for political balance. Committees that are not required to be politically balanced are not included.

The table above is not the only possible permutation which would meet the requirements for political balance.
8. The political groups have nominated the individual members they wish to fulfil their allocations on each committee, and the council is invited to make those individual appointments at today's meeting. It is obliged to follow the nominations of each group to seats allocated to that group. The nominations are set out in appendix 2 .
9. Members are also invited to appoint a chairman and vice-chairman to each committee. Appendix 1 also contains recommendations as to chairmanships and vice-chairmanships.

## BLACKPOOL, FYLDE AND WYRE ECONOM IC PROSPERITY BOARD

10. The council is part of a joint committee with Blackpool and Wyre councils known as the Blackpool, Fylde and Wyre Economic Prosperity Board. The membership of the joint committee is one councillor from each authority, with the joint committee also having three co-opted members. The joint committee is not required to be politically balanced ${ }^{7}$.

## LICENSING COM M ITTEE

11. The Licensing Committee is not subject to the political balance rules. It is concerned exclusively with carrying out the council's responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003 and the Gambling Act 2005. The committee has a membership of 12 and the council is invited to appoint that number of members to the committee, including appointments as chairman and vice-chairman. By convention, all Public Protection Committee members also sit as members of the Licensing Committee.
M EM BER DEVELOPM ENT STEERING GROUP
12. It is proposed that the Member Development Steering Group is formally discontinued. The group was an internal working group, and its functions were leading, co-ordinating and monitoring the Council's actions in delivering the Member Development Strategy and taking the lead on general member welfare matters. It is understood that these matters in the new committee structure will be championed and progressed under the auspices of one of the new lead members.
