# Public Platform

There were no speakers on this occasion.

1. Declarations of Interest

Members were reminded that any disclosable pecuniary interests should be declared as required by the Localism Act 2011 and any personal or prejudicial interests should be declared as required by the Council's Code of Conduct for Members. No interests were declared on this occasion.

## 4. <u>Expressions of Interest and Request for Section 106 Funding for Lytham Road, Warton from Jigsaw Homes</u> <u>Group</u>

Kirstine Riding, Housing Services Manager, presented the report detailing a revised scheme from Adactus (Jigsaw Homes Group) for the delivery of 26 homes for affordable rent at Lytham Road, Warton. The development would consist of a mixture of one and two bedroom apartments, two and three bedroom houses and two bedroom bungalows. The development site was on brownfield land and was allocated as development land within the local plan. Planning had been approved on the 24th June 2020.

Mrs Riding explained that the providers had secured additional funding amounting to £1,807,000 to deliver the scheme. An additional £260,000 was being requested from Section 106 Funds, equating to a capital contribution rate of £10,000 per unit. As off-site S106 funding for affordable housing was usually in the region of £50,000 per unit, or 50% of the total scheme costs, this scheme provided value for money for S106 funding at 12.5% of unit costs.

The Committee RESOLVED to:

- 1. Approve the Expression of Interest by Adactus (Jigsaw Homes Group) for the use of Section 106 funds for the delivery of 26 affordable homes at Lytham Road, Warton.
- Recommend to full Council approval of a fully funded addition to the Capital Programme "Affordable Housing Scheme at Lytham Road, Warton" phased over two financial years (2020/21 and 2021/22) for £260,000 to be met from a portion of S106 developer contributions for affordable housing currently held by the Council for this purpose (from Agreement Ref: 12/0717 - Moss Farm, Cropper Road, Westby); and
- 3. Authorise drawdown of the expenditure (subject to approval by Council to the addition to the Capital Programme) phased equally over two financial years (2020/21 and 2021/22) for £260,000 to Adactus (Jigsaw Homes Group) after regard and consideration of the compliance with the financial regulations covered within the body of the report.

# 5. Public Space Protection Orders: Alcohol Consumption

Ian Curtis, Head of Governance, introduced a report on the ten public spaces protection orders (PSPOs) that are in force in different parts of the borough restricting the consumption of alcohol. The effect of each order is that an individual, when required by a constable, must not consume alcohol, and must surrender any alcohol to the constable. Individuals can be prosecuted or given a fixed penalty of up to £100 if they do not comply.

Mr Cutis explained that the ten PSPOs were originally made as designated public places orders (DPPOs) under the Policing and Crime Act 2001. That act was repealed by the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 and DPPOs were automatically converted to PSPOs three years after the commencement of the 2014 act. According to statutory guidance, the PSPOs remain in force until October 14 2020 when they would then lapse unless extended.

Following support from members for the continuation of the PSPO's it was RESOLVED:-

- 1. That the Committee is minded to extend all of the public spaces protection orders described in the report for a further three years,
- 2. In relation to each order that authority is delegated to the Director of Resources to carry out the necessary consultation, publicity and notification and then to extend the order, unless the director considers that the order ought not to be extended until a response to the consultation or publicity has been considered by the committee at a special meeting.

# 6. Appointment to Outside Bodies/Working Groups

Tracy Manning, Director of Resources, introduced the report requesting the committee to review the appointments to any Outside Bodies and Working Groups that were within the remit of the committee.
