Prayers

1. Declarations of Interest

Councillor Shirley Green declared a personal interest in Item 8 – MTFS Update, Including General Fund, Capital Programme and Treasury Management for 2022/23 to 2026/27 insofar as she was Council representative on Lytham Hall Partnership.

Councillor Tim Armit declared a personal and prejudicial interest on the amendment to Item 8 – MTFS Update, Including General Fund, Capital Programme and Treasury Management for 2022/23 to 2026/27 and left the room during the discussion and voting on the amendment to the item.

Decision Items

8. <u>Medium Term Financial Strategy Update, Including General Fund, Capital Programme and Treasury</u> Management for 2022/23 to 2026/27

Councillor Anthony left the room having declared a personal and prejudicial interest in the item.

Councillor Karen Buckley, Leader of the Council, introduced the budget for 2023/24 stating that it was a privilege to be able to freeze the council tax bills for 2023/24. Councillor Buckley referred to the great deal of investment to the borough that included the Kirkham Futures Scheme, the St Annes Sea Defence scheme, development of water sports at Fairhaven Lake and the investment in the M55 Link Road.

Councillor Buckley referred to the difficult financial backdrop faced by many residents with the rising cost of living, in particular energy and food. Due to the increasing pressures and the robust financial position of the Council it was proposed not to raise the Council Tax for 2023/24.

The Leader of the Council went on to thank the Chief Financial Officer and his team for their hard work and diligence in maintaining the Council finances and to the Chief Executive for the handling of the Covid recovery and facing challenges head on.

The proposal was moved by Councillor Buckley and seconded by Councillor Vince Settle.

Councillors Small, Sayward, Dixon, Green and Redcliffe spoke in support of the proposed budget with Councillor Silverwood thanking the Finance Team for their dedication and commitment to the finances all year round.

Councillor Buckley briefly summed up and thanked all colleagues that had spoken.

Councillor Matthew Lee, having indicated earlier that he had an amendment, proposed;

"I propose that the remaining budget of £338,000 allocated for the Fairhaven Kiosk / Ice Cream Bar Project be excluded from the Updated Five Year Capital Programme and moved to General Reserves until such a time that a new scheme can be created and costed"

In moving his amendment Councillor Lee stressed that he did not want to debate the merits of the project but that the proposed amendment was simply a prudent financial decision as a result of the unprecedented rises in the costs of materials and labour.

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The amendment was seconded by Councillor Gill.

Before the debate on the amendment, Councillor Armit declared a personal and prejudicial interest and left the room.

During the debate Councillor Sayward confirmed that the aspiration remained to deliver the project and if a new revised scheme was deemed not viable then the funds would be returned to reserves.

Following a brief debate, Councillor Buckley summed up and a recorded vote was taken where the amendment was LOST.

The proposal was CARRIED, and it was therefore RESOLVED:

That the Council note the recommendations of the Finance and Democracy Committee meeting of 20th February 2023 and the decisions approved at the Council meeting of 6th February 2023, and approves as follows:

- (a) The revised estimates for 2022/23 and the revenue budget for 2023/24 as set out in Appendix E, which includes recommended transfers to the Capital Investment Reserve in 2022/23 and 2023/24 equivalent to the balance of the revenue surplus for those years, currently estimated at £0.400m in 2022/23 and £0.186m in 2023/24;
- (b) The budget proposals and changes to Reserves and Balances as set out in Appendices F & H, to include approval that the Council will act as the accountable body for any of the new capital schemes (as indicated) in Appendix F;
- (c) The Capital Strategy 2023-27, including Prudential Indicators and Limits, set out in Appendix G; which incorporates the Treasury Management Policy, the Capital Programme, the Treasury Management Strategy, the Investment Strategy and the Minimum Revenue Provision Statement;
- (d) The updated Useable Reserves & Balances Policy as detailed in Appendix H;
- (e) An average Band D Council Tax of £218.89 for 2023/24 (excluding Town and Parish precepts), which is a 0.14% decrease from the 2022/23 average Band D charge;
- (f) The Special Expenses policy as set out in Appendix I; which includes that:
 - for the purposes of charging special expenses, both the special expense costs and the tax bases relating to the areas of Lytham and St Annes will each be aggregated and the Council Tax charge per property at each band level will be the same across the whole area; and
 - the annual special expense charge per property will be set for 2023/24 with a 0.0% increase on the 2022/23 level, that being £80.92 per band D property; and

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- the annual borough wide charge per property will be set for 2023/24 with a 0.0% increase on the 2022/23 level, that being £172.47 per band D property; and
- the budget resource to be allocated to delivering concurrent services and chargeable as special expenses for 2023/24 will be set at a sum equivalent to the annual special expense charge per property (band D equivalent) multiplied by the tax base for the special expense area; and
- (g) The schedule of fees and charges for 2023/24 as detailed in Appendix J.
- (h) That the Council note the response to the Budget Consultation at Appendix K.

 - a. £45,036,808 Being the aggregate of the amounts which the Council estimates for the items set out in Section 31A(2) of the Act taking into account all precepts issued to it by Parish Councils.
 - **b. £36,830,333** Being the aggregate of the amounts which the Council estimates for the items set out in Section 31A(3) of the Act.
 - c. £8,206,475 Being the amount by which the aggregate at 4(a) above exceeds the aggregate at 4(b) above, calculated by the Council, in accordance with Section 31A(4) of the Act, as its Council Tax requirement for the year. (Item R in the formula in Section 31B of the Act).

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6. In accordance with Section 52ZB and the principles determined by the Secretary of State under section 52ZC of the Local Government Finance Act 1992, the Council determines that the basic amount of Council Tax for the financial year 2023/24 is **not** excessive.

As the billing authority, the Council has **not** been notified by a major precepting authority that its relevant basic amount of Council Tax for 2023/24 is excessive and consequently the billing authority is **not** required to hold a referendum in accordance with Section 52ZK Local Government Finance Act 1992.

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
