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LICENSING ACT 2003

THE LICENSING ACT 2003 (HEARINGS) REGULATIONS 2005 PROCEDURE FOR THE CONDUCT OF REMOTE HEARINGS

1. Preliminary

- 1.1. Under the regulations, the Licensing Authority is required to determine the procedure that it proposes to follow at any hearing under the Act.
- 1.2. During the restrictions associated with the coronavirus pandemic, Fylde's licensing panels will follow the procedure set out in this document instead of their normal procedure, subject to any changes that the panel makes for a particular hearing.
- 1.3. During this period all hearings will be held remotely. Participants and members of the public will access the hearing via the Zoom platform (www.zoom.us).
- 1.4. Any reference in this procedure to a hearing, or to participating in or attending a hearing, is a reference to a hearing held as set out on 1.3.
- 1.5. Please refer to the regulations for other rules about procedure

2. Interpretation

3. Before the hearing

- 3.1. At least ten days before the hearing, the panel will meet to consider:
 - 3.1.1. If the circumstances set out in regulation 9(1) apply, whether to dispense with holding a hearing;

- 3.1.2. What, if any, particular points it considers it will want clarification on at the hearing from a party under regulation 7(1)(d), and
- 3.1.3. What time limit to set under regulation 24.
- 3.2. If it is not practicable for the panel to meet to consider these matters, the convenor may ascertain the views of panel members separately and give effect to the majority view as if it had been reached in a meeting of the panel.

4. Opening the hearing

- 4.1. The legal officer will identify all participants.
- 4.2. The legal officer will then explain to the parties the procedure to be followed at the hearing, specifically drawing attention to any departures from the procedures set out in this document and the reasons for them. The legal officer will also inform the parties that the proceedings will be recorded.
- 4.3. The panel will then consider any request by a party under regulation 8(2) for another person to appear at the hearing. The convenor will give any party who has made such a request (or their representative) which the panel proposes to deny an opportunity to address the panel about their request. The panel will then re-consider the request.
- 4.4. The convenor may invite any officer to carry out any functions under this paragraph.

5. Zoom protocols

- 5.1. The legal officer or any other officer nominated by the convenor will act as the host for the Zoom meeting, under the overall direction of the convenor.
- 5.2. Video and audio settings would be monitored and where necessary mandated by the host as set out below, unless otherwise directed by the convenor:

5.3. The host will hide participants whose video is off. This ensures that the only participants on screen are panel members, officers, representatives or parties representing themselves and any witness who is addressing the panel at that particular time.

6. Listening to the parties

- 6.1. Each of the parties will then be invited to:
 - 6.1.1. Open their case by addressing the panel;
 - 6.1.2. Give any further information requested by the panel under regulation 7(1)(d);
 - 6.1.3. Present the evidence of any witness; and
 - 6.1.4. Conclude their case by addressing the panel.
- 6.2. The order in which the parties will be invited to put their cases will be in the discretion of the panel, except that a party who is an applicant will be invited to put their case last.

7. Questioning the parties

- 7.1. Members of the panel may, following the conclusion of the case of each party, ask questions of that party or any witness appearing for them.
- 7.2. A party or their representative may only question another party if they have asked for permission from the panel after the panel members have finished questioning that party or their witness. The panel will only give permission if it is satisfied that the questioning will provide useful information about a matter relevant to their determination which is unlikely to be placed before the panel without such questioning.

8. Time limits

Each party will be limited to the time set by the panel under regulation 24 in which to exercise their rights provided in paragraphs 6 and 7.2. The convenor will require the party or their representative to close their case or cease their questioning immediately this time limit is reached.

9. Considering the decision

- 9.1. The hearing will conclude after all parties have presented their case and responded to any questions. The panel will then deliberate on its decision by whatever means it considers to be appropriate.
- 9.2. The panel may, while it is considering its decision, seek advice from legal or licensing officers, either verbally or in writing. Officers will limit their advice to the specific issue identified by the panel.
- 9.3. When the panel has reached its decision, it may ask the legal, licensing or committee officers to review and offer observations on the draft decision notice.

10. Communicating the decision

10.1. The decision will be sent in writing to all parties in accordance with the regulations.

- 1. The application is for a variation to the premises licence FY PL0198 which relates to The Ship Inn, High Street, Elswick.

- 5. As relevant representations have been made, it is the duty of the panel to take such of the steps set out below as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are
 - (a) grant the application; and/or
 - (b) modify the conditions of the licence; or
 - (c) reject the whole or part of the application.
- 6. The Guidance issued by the Secretary of State and the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy will be material in considering the application, but cannot override the licensing objectives.
- 7. The following parts of the Secretary of State's guidance appear to be particularly relevant to the application and the relevant representations:
 - 2.15 Public Nuisance
 - 8.13 Other persons

 - 9.42 Determining actions that are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives

Further information

- 9. Following mediation with the Police and Environmental Protection (who are responsible authorities) the applicant has agreed a number of conditions as detailed below to be attached to the licence and to remove one condition which has been replaced with a new condition. The Panel is therefore requested to consider attaching the conditions to the licence.
 - 1. An adequate number of licensed door supervisors shall be on duty as appropriate to any risk assessment.
 - 2. CCTV will be installed internally and externally at the premises and will comply with the following:
 - The CCTV system shall be installed, maintained and operated to the reasonable satisfaction of Lancashire Constabulary. All public areas of the premises are to be covered by the system. The system will incorporate a camera covering the entrance door and will be capable of providing an image which is regarded as identification standard.
 - The system will display the correct date and time
 - The system will make recordings during all hours the premises are open to the public
 - Digital recordings shall be held for a minimum of 21 days after the recording is made and will be made available to the Police or any authorised persons for inspection upon request.
 - The system will, as a minimum, record images of the head and shoulders of all persons entering the premises.
 - A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system will be able to attend the
 premises within an hour if requested; at all times the premises are open to the public. This staff
 member will be able to show police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when
 requested.
 - 3. No regulated entertainment to take place outside after 11pm on any day.
 - 4. No nuisance shall be caused by noise coming from the premises (including patron noise/voices, regulated entertainment or by vibration transmitted through the structure of the premises.
 - 5. The outdoor area as shown in the red line on the approved Licensing Plan shall cease to be used for the consumption of alcohol and food at 22.00 hours. All external doors and windows shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is being provided except in the event of an emergency or for the purpose of access and egress.
 - 6. Refuse such as bottles shall be disposed of in any external area of the premises at a time when it is not likely to cause a disturbance to sensitive premises. They shall not be disposed of between the hours of 20.00-08.00.
 - 7. On any occasion that regulated entertainment is carried on at the premises, regular assessments of the noise emanating from the premises will be undertaken. Wherever said assessments indicate that noise is likely to cause nuisance to any local residents, remedial action will be taken.

Condition 2.15 Regular assessments of the noise coming from the premises will be conducted on every occasion the premises are used for regulated entertainment







I note that The Ship pub, in Elswick, is undergoing building / renovation works, and that Punch Taverns has applied for a variation to premises license which effectively allow it to be open from 7am to 11pm every day, or midnight on bank holidays and weekends.

I am opposed to this for the following reasons:

The addition of "a covered canopy / conservatory and also the permitting the use of a pop up / temporary bar servery until 23:00h any day within the external area" and "permit late night refreshment on a Friday and Saturday from 23:00h until 00:00h...", as well as bank holidays etc would create a huge amount of late night noise (especially during summer months) for residents whose properties border the external beer garden, as well as significant additional traffic through the village and surrounding areas after closing time.

This is a massive change compared with the previous existing use (food orders taken until 9pm, the pub was usually closed by 10:30pm). The pub was already busy lunchtimes and evenings, but only causing occasional congestion (eg mothers sunday)

Furthermore, I fail to see justification for the significantly extended licencing hours, and as there isn't high enough population density locally to support this endeavour, it would rely on drawing in business from further afield, creating more late night noise and traffic problems over and above that caused by the additional canopy / conservatory serving alcohol until midnight at weekends / holidays.

Thank you for your mail, and apologies for the delayed response, it landed in my junk folder.

The additional conditions are "well and good" on paper, but would be difficult / impossible to enforce in practice, especially during warmer months. There were already occasional noisy afternoon / evenings from events held at the Ship (bonfire night, wedding receptions), but these were fairly rare, only a couple of times a year (pre covid). It would be noisy every weekend and bank holiday, and many evenings during summer months.

"no nuisance shall be caused by noise coming from the premises..." and "the outdoor area ... shall cease to be used for the consumption of food and alcohol after 22:00 hours..." - if alcohol is being served / consumed indoors until midnight then drinkers will be outside enjoying the beer garden. If only on the pretext of having a cigarette (or being out with their mates who are having a smoke). Nice words on paper but completely impracticable - are the drinking punters really going to be rounded up like a flock of sheep and shut indoors at 10pm?

Even a 10pm outdoor "curfew" is massively later than the previous use, where food orders stopped being taken at 8pm (and the Ship was often empty by 10pm.)

Likewise, it is unrealistic to expect there will be no additional noise from live entertainment - do they expect us to believe that all the windows and doors will be kept closed (especially during warmer months)? And when there is "excessive noise" from entertainment, are local residents expected to ask the bar staff at the Ship to turn it down?

The reply in no way addresses the issues linked to additional (late night) traffic and congestion from additional parking. The population density locally wasn't enough to support the previous use of the Ship, this extended use will require the Ship to attract business from a much wider catchment area; the very limited public transport means customers will be driving to the village then returning home late at night.

Lastly but not least, the statement that "refuse such as bottles shall ... not be disposed of between 20:00 and 8:00..." . Previous experience was that bottles were taken out at all hours when the pub was open. And (not under the pub's control), the trade recycling was collected early mornings (tremendous racket from emptying the bottle bank)

Good morning

Thank you for your email and comments and I will forward to the applicants Solicitors.

In respect of the earlier opening times, these are to enable breakfasts etc to be served, there are no changes to the times for licensable activities.

The premises already benefits from the bank holiday extensions for the supply of alcohol, the extension requested is to enable late night refreshment, hot food, to be supplied during this period. Attached is a copy of the licence and application.

They have also agreed to the following additional conditions following representations from the Police and Environmental Protection:

No regulated entertainment to take place outside after 11pm on any day.

No nuisance shall be caused by noise coming from the premises (including patron noise/voices, **regulated entertainment** or by vibration transmitted through the structure of the premises.

The outdoor area as shown in the red line on the approved Licensing Plan shall cease to be used for the consumption of alcohol and food at 22.00 hours. All external doors and windows shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is being provided except in the event of an emergency or for the purpose of access and egress.

Refuse such as bottles shall be disposed of in any external area of the premises at a time when it is not likely to cause a disturbance to sensitive premises. They shall not be disposed of between the hours of 20.00- 08.00.

On any occasion that regulated entertainment is carried on at the premises, regular assessments of the noise emanating from the premises will be undertaken. Wherever said assessments indicate that noise is likely to cause nuisance to any local residents, remedial action will be taken.

- 1. An adequate number of licensed door supervisors shall be on duty as appropriate to any risk assessment.
- 2. CCTV will be installed internally and externally at the premises and will comply with the following:
 - The CCTV system shall be installed, maintained and operated to the reasonable satisfaction of Lancashire Constabulary. All public areas of the premises are to be covered by the system. The system will incorporate a camera covering the entrance door and will be capable of providing an image which is regarded as identification standard.
 - The system will display the correct date and time
 - The system will make recordings during all hours the premises are open to the public
 - Digital recordings shall be held for a minimum of 21 days after the recording is made and will be made available to the Police or any authorised persons for inspection upon request.

• The system will, as a minimum, record images of the head and shoulders of all persons entering the premises.

A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system will be able to attend the premises within an hour if requested; at all times the premises are open to the public. This staff member will be able to show police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

Can you please advise whether you still wish to object to the application.

I wish to object to the application from the Ship public house in Elswick for opening to midnight on Friday and Saturdays and for an outside pop-up bar. The Ship is situated in a quiet residential area and is surrounded by houses. Whilst i am keen to ensure that village pubs prosper in these uncertain times, I consider that a blanket authorisation for late night opening will create noise from revelers up to at least 12-30 am at weekends. This is unacceptable. The Ship has previously had a chequered history. Whilst it has operated for many years as a gastro pub, closing at 9-30 to 10pm every night, the parish council received many complaints of late- night noise when it was simply a pub. The sensible thing would be to reject the blanket extension which would not prevent the landlord from applying for an extension on special occasions but would allow the Borough Council to monitor the situation and residents to object if there are problems. I similarly i wish to object to the outside pop- up bar as this would encourage revellers to drink outside until quite late creating further noise problems for residents.

We wish to make a representation following an application under the Licensing Act 2003 by Punch Taverns. This being due by 5 January 2022.

We have been residents since July 1976 of Elswick. Our property being adjacent to The Ship and overlooks the rear of the building and its extensive external rear garden area. Our rear boundary being separated from the parallel boundary of The Ship external area by a narrow public footpath.

In the past The Ship has been well managed and respected the tranquillity of our award Winning Village. It has not infringed on the space and noise level of its immediate surrounding area during its normal business activities under successive control of the occupying tenants.

The addition of a covered canopy/conservatory to the rear of the premises will present increased noise compared to other internal areas which benefit from the much more robust protective insulating construction of the main building.

Further more the use of a proposed "pop up/ temporary bar" until 23.00h any day is of concern. Plan drawing 2129-502 does not show the proposed location? We sent an email 22 December 2021 to Inventive Design Associates acting on behalf of Punch Taverns requesting details of its location but have not received to date any reply.

The early morning 7.00h opening is of concern in that a potential increase in traffic will present dangers to pupils arriving to join school buses parked directly opposite The Ship. Early morning traffic within the village particularly on the High Street is already increasing as a result of new building developments including those in Great Eccleston and surrounding nearby villages as residents make their way to work and the M55.

It has just been necessary to introduce traffic calming safety measures on the High Street by way of an illuminated vehicle speed indicator which presently and unfortunately only faces one way.

We feel the stated additional late night opening hours are very undesirable and not necessary to adequately serve the needs of The Ship patrons and to protect the historical tranquillity of village life.

For may years The Ship has been well patronised during existing opening times. In fact it has generally been closed by 9.00pm fully meeting the needs of its customers many of whom were regulars and indeed the financial viability of its tenants. We have no desire to see it develop into a late night venue.

We understand that representations relating to this application are to be made by 5th January.

We live on High Street, Elswick, next-door-but-one to The Ship Hotel, having moved here in 1975. For many years now The Ship appears to have been well-run and has not generally presented problems of noise or unacceptable behaviour or traffic congestion.

It appears that Punch Taverns are looking to expand the opening hours and the scope and volume of business. The addition of a covered-canopy area at the rear of the premises will almost certainly increase the noise level experienced by neighbours and we note that the application includes a bar with late-night opening in this area.

Elswick is an attractive and quiet rural village which is extremely well-kept and it is a pleasure to live here. So far as we are aware there is no demand amongst local people for alcohol to be served beyond existing licensing hours. We are concerned that the extension of bar opening hours until late into the night may attract noisier and less well-behaved customers.

So far as early morning breakfast opening is concerned, you are probably aware that there are bus stops immediately outside The Ship on both sides of the road and this is where the secondary school pupils wait for their school buses between approximately 7.15 a.m. and 8.45 a.m. each weekday. Some of them walk to the bus stop, others are brought by parents in cars. Customers driving into and out of The Ship car park would need to be extremely careful, particularly on dark mornings.

Please take our concerns into account when dealing with this application.

We strongly OBJECT to the proposed variation of premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of The Ship, High Street, Elswick for the following reasons:


- 1. The addition of a covered canopy/conservatory is unnecessary given the substantial size of the existing premises this will generate additional noise disturbance and intrusion on the nearby residential properties particularly as it will not be possible to provide sufficient 'sound proofing' compared to the main substantive building.
- 2. The proposed pop up/temporary bar until 23.00 on any day is unnecessary given the substantial size of the existing premises this will generate additional noise disturbance and intrusion on the nearby residential properties. It will not be possible to provide sufficient 'sound proofing' compared to the main substantive building and could lead to unruly and antisocial behaviour in the garden of the public house and have a negative impact on the peace and tranquillity neighbouring properties currently enjoy.
- 3. The proposed extension of opening hours beyond 23.00 hours are excessive and unnecessary other than for special occasions and will be detrimental to local residents, particularly the proposed extension on New Year's Eve until permitted opening hours on 1st January, which in the absence of any overnight accommodation for guests at the pub, is excessive and unnecessary. As well as generating additional noise disturbance for local residents and traffic late at night, we are concerned that the extended opening hours both at weekends and New Year's Eve could increase the risk of drink driving and hence other serious road and personal safety consequences as It is virtually impossible to get a taxi to/from the village late at night.
- 4. The proposed early morning 7.00 opening is excessive and unnecessary as there is unlikely to be sufficient demand for breakfast and tea/coffee in a quiet rural village. It will generate additional traffic on roads which are becoming increasingly busy as a result of significant development in the locality and road safety dangers to local school children waiting/being dropped off at the bus stops on both sides of the road outside The Ship.
- 5. Our property backs on to the rear end of The Ship's garden, separated only by a narrow public footpath. We have not had any problems with The Ship under its most recent ownership/management as a gastro pub and are happy for it to continue to operate in a similar format/hours. However prior to that when it operated as 'just a pub', there were regular instances of antisocial behaviour in the beer garden and late night noise from revellers walking home through the adjacent residential streets which we do not want to materialise again. A "Wetherspoons-type" operation as would now appear to be being proposed is completely inappropriate in a rural location such as this in which there is no public transport in the evenings and where taxis are extremely hard to come by at the best

of times! We seriously question the demand for the extent of and scale of the proposed operation.

Please ensure these objections are taken into account in determining this application and let us know the outcome in due course.

- 3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

- **4.** The responsible person must ensure that-
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2014

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

- 2.1 A suitable level of Illumination shall be provided to the exterior of the premises.
- 2.2 Appropriate emergency lighting shall be maintained for the interior and exterior of the premises.
- 2.3 Appropriate exit signs shall be maintained at the premises and shall be clearly visible.
- 2.4 Regular checks shall be made of the toilet accommodation at the premises.
- 2.5 All fire fighting equipment shall be regularly serviced.
- 2.6 All portable appliances shall be tested annually.
- 2.7 A current gas safety certificate shall be maintained for the premises.
- 2.8 A suitable accident book shall be provided and maintained for both the public and staff.
- 2.9 The departure of customers shall be effectively managed and customers shall be prevented from congregating outside the premises.
- 2.10 Unsupervised children shall not be allowed on the premises at any time and no children shall be permitted on the premises after 21.30 hours.
- 2.11 No children shall be permitted at the bar area of the premises.
- 2.12 All gaming machines shall be visible from the bar of the premises.
- 2.13 Clear, legible and conspicuous notices requesting patrons to leave the premises quietly shall be displayed on the premises.



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- 2.14 All external doors and windows shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is being provided except in the event of an emergency.
- 2.15 Regular assessments of the noise coming from the premises will be conducted on every occasion the premises are used for regulated entertainment.

ANNEX 3 - CONDITIONS ATTACHED AFTER A HEARING BY THE LICENSING AUTHORITY

- 3.1 All staff shall have received suitable training in relation to the proof of age scheme to be applied upon the premises. Records to evidence this shall be made available to an authorised officer upon request.
- 3.2 Appropriate measures will be taken to ensure staff prevent the removal of bottles or glasses from the curtilage and grounds of the licensed premises.
- 3.3 At least one personal licence holder shall be available and/or contactable by telephone while the supply or sale of alcohol is being undertaken (who's identity shall be known to all other staff engaged in the supply or sale of alcohol) except in the case of emergency.
- 3.4 Only toughened glass vessels shall be used to dispense beverages to customers.
- 3.5 Another member of staff shall be nominated to act for the Designated Premises Supervisor, in their absence, whose identity is known by all other staff when such absence occurs
- 3.6 Risk assessments carried out by or on behalf of the licence holder which relate to a licensing objective shall be available for inspection by an officer or a Responsible Authority.
- 3.7 The volume of amplified sound used in connection with entertainment shall at all times be under the control of the licensee or management and the controlling mechanism shall be operated from a part of the premises inaccessible to the public.
- 3.8 The premises shall be operated in accordance with the principles outlined by the 'Nightsafe' Scheme, as are relevant to those premises, and indicated in the associated leaflet.
- 3.9 Frequent collection of glasses and bottles shall be undertaken to ensure that empty containers do not accumulate in or around the licensed premises.
- 3.10 All live and recorded music shall finish no later than 00.00 hours except for all agreed Bank holidays.
- 3.11 A clear, legible and conspicuous notice requesting patrons to avoid causing noise, nuisance or disturbance to local residents shall be displayed at every exit.
- 3.12 The external drinking area shall be cleared of customers by 23.20 hours.
