LICENSING ACT 2003

THE LICENSING ACT 2003 (HEARINGS) REGULATIONS 2005

PROCEDURE FOR THE CONDUCT OF HEARINGS

1. Preliminary

- 1.1. Under the regulations, the Licensing Authority is required to determine the procedure that it proposes to follow at any hearing under the Act. This document sets out the procedure that Fylde will normally follow.
- 1.2. A panel may decide to follow a different procedure at any hearing. If it does, it will specifically draw attention to any departures from the procedures set out in this document and the reasons for them.
- 1.3. Please refer to the regulations for other rules about procedure

2. Interpretation

In this procedure, the following words or phrases have the following meanings:

3. Before the hearing

- 3.1. At least ten days before the hearing, the panel will meet to consider:
 - 3.1.1. If the circumstances set out in regulation 9(1)apply, whether to dispense with holding a hearing;
 - 3.1.2. What, if any, particular points it considers it will want clarification on at the hearing from a party under regulation 7(1)(d), and
 - 3.1.3. What time limit to set under regulation 24.
- 3.2. If it is not practicable for the panel to meet to consider these matters, the convenor may ascertain the views of panel members separately and give effect to the majority view as if it had been reached in a meeting of the panel.

4. Opening the hearing

- 4.1. The convenor will identify all parties to the hearing who are present. The convenor will also identify any persons who are present who intend to assist or represent any party and any witnesses.
- 4.2. The convenor will then explain to the parties the procedure to be followed at the hearing, specifically drawing attention to any departures from the procedures set out in this document

and the reasons for them. The convenor will also inform the parties that the proceedings will be recorded.

- 4.3. The panel will then consider any request by a party under regulation 8(2) for another person to appear at the hearing. The convenor will give any party who has made such a request (or their representative) which the panel proposes to deny an opportunity to address the panel about their request. The panel will then re-consider the request.
- 4.4. The convenor may invite any officer to carry out any functions under this paragraph.

5. Listening to the parties

- 5.1. Each of the parties will then be invited to:
 - 5.1.1. Open their case by addressing the panel;
 - 5.1.2. Give any further information requested by the panel under regulation 7(1)(d);
 - 5.1.3. Present the evidence of any witness; and
 - 5.1.4. Conclude their case by addressing the panel.
- 5.2. The order in which the parties will be invited to put their cases will be in the discretion of the panel, except that a party who is an applicant will be invited to put their case last.

6. Questioning the parties

- 6.1. Members of the panel may, following the conclusion of the case of each party, ask questions of that party or any witness appearing for them.
- 6.2. A party or their representative may only question another party if they have asked for permission from the panel after the panel members have finished questioning that party or their witness. The panel will only give permission if it is satisfied that the questioning will provide useful information about a matter relevant to their determination which is unlikely to be placed before the panel without such questioning

7. Time limits

Each party will be limited to the time set by the panel under regulation 24 in which to exercise their rights provided in paragraphs 5 and 6.2. The convenor will require the party or their representative to close their case or cease their questioning immediately this time limit is reached.

8. Considering the decision

- 8.1. The panel will consider their decision in private.
- 8.2. No officers will retire with the panel except for the committee administrator. The committee administrator may, if requested to do so, provide procedural, but not legal or technical, advice to the panel. The committee administrator will also assist the panel by drafting and finalising the wording of the panel's decision, if requested by the panel.
- 8.3. The panel may, while it is considering its decision, seek advice from legal or licensing officers. Officers will limit their advice to the specific issue identified by the panel and will leave the room where the panel is considering its decision as soon as that advice has been given and understood.

9. Announcing the decision

- 9.1. When the panel has made its decision, the public part of the meeting will resume.
- 9.2. The convenor will read out the decision of the panel, or may invite the committee administrator to do so. The meeting will then close or move on to the next business.

- The application proposes to supply alcohol at a previously unlicensed outlet. If this application is granted, there is a real potential for increased crime and disorder in and around the premises, including damage to property/vehicles, violent behaviour and drunkenness. There are consequential implications on Public safety, Prevention of Public Nuisance and Protection of Children from Hann.
- The area is well catered for with licensed premises of a similar nature and if granted • the competition between the different premises will force prices down and alcohol will become more freely available.
- The proximity of the premises to local residential property is likely to have an adverse • affect on the people who reside there, in so far as an increase in noise, litter and antisocial behaviour. Any increase in incidents will result in an increase in Police attendance to the premises and locality.
- The applicant is already the Designated Premises Supervisor for a similar outlet on St Andrews Road South, St Annes. It is difficulat to understand why there is a need to sell alcohol from 06:00- 22:00 - sufficient outlets are available (at least 3 within 1 mile radius).

The provision of such a capbability will attract, in particular, the younger element who are likely to congregate locally - the geography of the location provides for a 'back road' entry on Chruch Road St Annes, with ginnel acces between properties.

Litter is already a local issue, that will be addedd too, as well as increased road traffic. It is likely that the ginnel areas will become urinals, as well as collecting the discarded rubbish droppings. Drives are regularly obstructed, and clearly this will add.

Note that the area is already an Alcohol Restricted area.

Noise from deliveries will increase, particularly those at 06:00. Car radios, door slamming, etc will be possible through the full time frame of 06:00-22:00. Not something to be 'enjoyed', as will the disticnt possibility (this happens elsewhere) of roaming groups of youths/teenagers of both genders adding to the general disturbance, including 'anti-social behaviour'. These activites could be seen as harrassment, and /or endemic to 'crime' levels, particularly as Drug misuse/abuse is of significance within 100 yards of the shop location - Lancashire Police will be able to provide explicit detail.

Could the application be amended in any way to remedy your concern? If so, how? Suggest Alcohol Licence be refused - limiting hours will be difficult to police and enforce.

Nuisance

The existing businesses consist of a bakery, sandwich shop, ex news agents and chip shop. All have limited opening hours, with the sandwich shop closing at 3pm, and the chip shop closing at 7pm. The proposed opening hours of the new premises are intended to be 6am to 11pm. This means that residents will have to put up with antisocial behaviour in a poorly lit and rarely policed area right up until one hour before midnight, and be woken by deliveries and vehicles from as early as 5am, (currently the sandwich shop has deliveries to it's front door at 5.30am preventing my family sleeping in the front bedroom of our house, unless we want to be woken every morning at 5.30am!!). Furthermore, the unlit alley between my house and the sandwich shop would be an area where people would congregate, causing yet further disturbance and spoiling the enjoyment of my property, to which I am rightly entitled without being subject to public nuisance. As it stands now we already suffer drunks urinating down the alley onto my gates, and throwing beer cans and rocks into my garden on the way home from the pub, having previously damaged my car at a cost to me of over £400. The addition of a licensed store will only add to these social problems, not help ease them.

Vandalism, Antisocial Behaviour crime and Disorder

Only a few weeks ago my neighbours car was damaged by somebody on their way home late at night, having picked up a bicycle that had been abandoned in the alleyway, they proceeded to throw it into his car windscreen for no apparent reason, smashing it and causing damage to the bodywork. A crime which still remains unsolved to this day. My neighbour across the road had his vehicle damaged during the night, only to discover the damage when he went to work the next day. Earlier in the year we were visited by a "Troop" of riot police over a period of three days who were attempting to arrest a person dealing in drugs in one of the adjacent streets.

Last year on Boxing Day there was the attempted murder of an innocent neighbour for no justifiable reason, he is believed to have said something that his attacker(s) didn't like, and ended up on a life support machine for it. This area does not need any further assistance to lower the standards in which the community has to live, it needs assistance and positive regeneration, not another premises licensed to sell alcohol, especially for such a period of opening as 17 consecutive hours per day. Litter.

I have made numerous complaints to the council regarding litter generated by both Jango's Catering and Briars bakery, yet nothing has ever been done about it. There are no rubbish bins, the only one there was, which was opposite the closed newsagents, and thus ignored, has now disappeared. As residents we constantly have to clear our gardens, and indeed the street, of litter that is just left lying around. The addition of a licensed store with late opening hours will only add to this problem. Children.

The alley way and surrounding areas are used as a playground by local children, where they can play football and play safely without fear of causing a disturbance, are close to home and able to be supervised in a relatively clean and safe area, and know that undesirables and youths will not be around to intimidate them. The addition of a licensed premises will have a damaging effect on this facility, with left over beer cans and bottles left lying around, the congregation of youths, not to mention the effects of yet another area where people can go to buy alcohol from very early in the morning to late at night, and it's subsequent after affects will have on their upbringing.

In addition, the current shops are a major attraction for schoolchildren going to and returning home from Lytham St Annes High School during the day, many of whom call in and meet up outside of the bakery to collect cakes and refreshments before continuing on their way. There will be an obvious temptation for these children to attempt to purchase alcohol, or ask older youths to buy it for them. In a society where alcohol is the biggest socially damaging factor in the health of individuals, we should be safeguarding the younger generation, rather than providing further means for them to purchase alcohol.

Part Continued

Car Parking and Deliveries

Currently we as residents have to put up with people visiting the shops who park directly across our driveways in their endeavours to get their purchases. Many times we are faced with abuse when we ask these people to move their cars or park further up the road within the designated parking bays. A licensed premise will increase the number of vehicles visiting this area, from very early in the morning right through to late at night, and this make it even more difficult for me/us to be able to safely park our own vehicles when we come home from work.

I have personally paid £100 to have a white H bar marked onto the road outside my house, and many times I have been forced into a confrontation when asking people to move their vehicle from in front of my driveway, even though they have quite clearly been parked illegally across the H bar. Unfortunately, I have on a number of occasions had to call the police when people have refused to move.

The parking provisions only just allow enough room for the residents to park their own cars at night, without having to make room for people wishing to call and purchase alcohol. When you consider the designated parking provisions made for the shops close by at Waddington Road, this area really is not suitable for the movement of a large number vehicles coming and going, which will also create an increased danger to the many children who live and play close by. Only last month a child was knocked off his bicycle when crossing the road at the junction of Curzon and Moorland Road.

In addition, with the proposed business wishing to open from 6am until 11pm there will undoubtedly be very early morning deliveries of provisions for the shop. In a residential area we do not wish to be woken up every time there is an early morning delivery by a HGV delivering beer or groceries, we suffer enough with the sandwich shop next door with their bread deliveries at 5.30am without having to add to it with additional vehicles, causing us subsequent reduced sleep.

Why should we have to suffer for the benefit of a shop owner who quite clearly has no concerns over the community's welfare by proposing to open so early and close so late.

7. Suggested amendments?

Could the licence be amended in any way to remedy your concern? If so, how?

No, the provision of licensed premises in this area is completely unwarranted, unjustified and completely irresponsible.

There are currently 5 premises operating within half a mile of this location, all opening until late into the evening hours, and all within 15 minutes walking distance. There is absolutely no social or residential requirement for this type of business in what is a mainly residential area with limited business use. It should remain this way for the benefit of the community.

Why should the residents of this street have their community further degenerated by yet another late shop selling alcohol when there are already five other similar shops close by, three of which judging by the recent comments in the local press, have been influential in assisting the degeneration of a once thriving social area into the most statistically deprived area of the borough?

Hello Mr Coombes, I wish to raise my concerns regarding a change of business use for one of the shops on Moorland Road. Briars Bakery is closing and he has let the premises to a third party who intends to change the business use from a bakery to a convenience store with proposed opening hours from 6am right through to 11pm, In addition a licensing application has been put forward to sell alcohol.

Whilst I have no objection to the change of use to a convenience store, I do object to the extended opening hours and indeed the proposals to sell alcohol. As it stands there are currently three premises on St Albans Road, one on Singleton Avenue and two on Waddington Road selling alcohol from early until late, all within half a mile of each other. There is absolutely no requirement for yet another shop selling alcohol in this area. The shops on this road have predominantly been used for servicing the employees of Moorland Rd government buildings, and have historically restricted their opening hours for many years to mid afternoon at the latest, and indeed have all have closed before 6pm, even the chip shop, allowing the residents at least some element of peace. The proposals put forward for the new convenience store will create a nuisance to residents from early morning, assuming deliveries will be made prior to opening at 5.30am right through to one hour before midnight, an opening period of 17 consecutive hours during which cars will be coming and going, youths will be congregating, car doors will be opening and closing, additional litter will be generate etc etc. At present we have to put up with early morning deliveries of bread and groceries to the sandwich shop, often as early as 5.30am, where the drivers play their radios and drag crates across the floor. The noise is so loud that I am no longer able to sleep in the front bedroom of my house unless I wish to woken every morning between the hours of 5.30 and 6am. I have approached the Environment Health department, who advise me that after taking a look early one morning they consider this level of disturbance to be acceptable and that it isn't regarded as a nuisance! They did also promise to provide me with noise monitoring equipment, but this promise never materialised. If we have another shop allowed to open so early then this will just create further public nuisance for the immediate residents.

All of the residents in the immediate vicinity of Moorland Rd shops have raised objections with the licensing authority because we don't wish to encourage further alcohol sales in what is a residential area.

There is an unlit alleyway between my house and the shops where youths could and would congregate, and an unlit entrance to a flat above the shops. The residents of which fear intimidation if youths start to congregate whilst hanging around the late opening shop, as they now do on St Albans Rd. With regards to the opening hours, I find this somewhat of a concern. The new tenant has not contacted any members of the immediate community to discuss his proposals to see if they had any concerns, and the first that we knew about the change of use was when a notice was put up in the bakers window. This obviously causes concern for us because if he has no interest in how his business affects the immediate neighbours, then my view is that he quite clearly doesn't care, which leads to further concern that in selling alcohol he may be of the same inconsiderate view. This is an area where large numbers of schoolchildren meet up on their way to and from school each day, where they can buy soft drinks, cakes etc in an alcohol free area. The addition of a licensed premises my well lead to many of these children attempting to purchase alcohol instead.

Also, the alleyway and shop frontage is currently an area where local young children play on the bikes, with footballs etc. The addition of a late shop selling alcohol will remove this much valued facility for them, and may lead to undesirables hanging around causing intimidation, thus removing the relative safety of the children's play area

As residents adjacent to these shops we currently suffer considerable littering caused by Jango's catering and Briars bakery, and despite asking the Environmental Health department to do something about it and provide a refuse bin closer to the shops, my requests have been ignored, and litter is just left to blow around. This isn't just a few scraps of paper, but many

sandwich wrappers and paper bags just carelessly discarded after leaving the shops, because there is nowhere to dispose of them. There was once a litter bin placed outside of the now closed newsagents, but this was out of sight and never used. This incidentally has now disappeared so there are now no litter bins at all.

Myself and two other residents attended the local police meeting at the bowling hut on Hope Street last night in the hope of discussing our concerns with the relevant authorities, but only one representative from the police turned up, who unfortunately wasn't able to offer much advice.

We now have just three weeks left before the licensing application goes before the council, but in this time would like to discuss my/our concerns with our local councillors in person.

Could you please come back to me at the earliest opportunity so that we can arrange a date and time to meet up and discuss our concerns?






The geography of the area does not suit, in that there are a number of back alleys in the vicinity where teenagers already congregate which would encourage on street and possibly under age drinking.




