## Question (1) received from Councillor Brian Gill (11 July 2020)

'As most of the members know, I am not a fan of the new crazy golf scheme currently in build at Fairhaven Lake at a cost of some five hundred thousand pounds of ratepayers money. The business case is fundamentally flawed due to the fact that it is spread over a ten year period and does not include the cost of money. Money is needed now to provide better support to the community. For example covering for shoppers in the high streets of Kirkham, Lytham and St Annes to increase the footfall.

That being said, I understand it is committed monies and I therefore need it to succeed as a ratepayer. With this in mind can the council inform the residents what measures are being taken to stop the proposed pay and display scheme for the length of the promenade which will have a detrimental effect on visitors to the proposed attraction as well as the impact on local residents.'
