### **PUBLIC ITEM**

This item is for consideration in the public part of the meeting.

#### **SUMMARY**

The purpose of this report is to advise Members of the implementation of sections of the Equality Act 2010, which impact on the taxi trade.

That the Committee consider the report to proceed with the publication of a list of designated vehicles in accordance with S.167 of The Equality Act 2010.

## **REPORT**

- 1. On 6th April 2017 Sections 165 and 167 of the Equality Act (The Act) came into force. For ease of reference, the sections are appended in full to this report at Appendix A.
- 2. To summarise, S165 places duties on the driver of a taxi or private hire vehicle, making it an offence not to offer reasonable assistance, to charge extra for providing any assistance, or to refuse a fare from a disabled passenger altogether.
- 3. S.167 grants Licensing Authorities the power to maintain a list of designated licensed vehicles which are wheelchair accessible, and should include the details only of vehicles which are capable of carrying a passenger in their wheelchair. The list should include the make and model of the vehicle, whether or not it is a hackney carriage or private hire vehicle, and the name of the proprietor or operator.
- 4. It is important to note that it is not a requirement of any Licensing Authority to maintain a list under S.167 of The Act, however, if the Authority decides not to maintain such a list, S.165 does not have effect.

- 5. Under S.166 of the Act, drivers may already apply for an exemption from their duties of assistance to passengers in wheelchairs on medical or physical grounds, and this exemption may be valid for a length of time that the Authority think appropriate. There no exemptions currently issued in Fylde.
- 6. <u>Statutory guidance</u> has now been published by the Department of Transport, and therefore Licensing Authorities are obliged to give it due regard when making relevant policy decisions.
- 7. Members will note that it is strongly recommended that Licensing Authorities do choose to maintain a list of designated vehicles, which in turn activates the provisions of S.165, making it an offence for drivers to fail to give reasonable assistance.
- 8. Having regard to the guidance issued, Members are asked to confirm that they wish Officers to undertake the preparation of a list of designated vehicles, and to construct a policy governing the application process for an exemption certificate.
- 9. Members are asked to note section 2.8 of the statutory guidance setting out a timeline for the implementation of the changes.
- 10. If Members are minded to instruct Officers to proceed with the preparation of the necessary documents and procedures, then the completed regime will be presented for final approval at a subsequent meeting of the Public Protection Committee on 15th June 2017, following which drivers will be given a period of time to apply for an exemption before the list of vehicles is published.
- 11. It should also be noted that the implementation of S.167 of The Equality Act 2010 will assist people with a disability to easily access an appropriate vehicle, therefore it is recommended to proceed with the publication of a list of designated vehicles in accordance with S.167 of The Equality Act 2010.
- 12. Members are therefore requested to consider the report and determine whether:
  - a) to proceed with the publication of a list of designated vehicles in accordance with S.167 of the Equality Act 2010.
  - b) Not to proceed with the publication of a list of designated vehicles in accordance with S.167 of the Equality Act 2010.

The implementation of S.167 of The Equality Act 2010 will assist people with a disability to easily access an appropriate vehicle, therefore it is recommended to proceed with the publication of a list of designated vehicles in accordance with S.167 of The Equality Act 2010.
