1. <u>Declarations of Interest</u>

Members were reminded that any disclosable pecuniary interests should be declared as required by the Localism Act 2011 and any personal or prejudicial interests should be declared as required by the Council's Code of Conduct for Members.

There were none on this occasion.

2. Budget Council Rules

The Mayor reminded members of the procedure rules for Budget Council and drew their attention to page 3 of the evening's agenda papers.

3. Confirmation of Minutes

RESOLVED: To approve the minutes of the meeting held on 5th February 2018 as a correct record for signature by the Mayor.

4. Mayor's Announcements

The Mayor welcomed everyone to the meeting in the new chamber, he offered his thanks to the members and officers for all their hard work.

He mentioned the All at Sea event and all who have contributed to the mayoral charity events.

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He advised that the Respect Awards evening would be held on Tuesday 10 April. 38 nominations had been received from the schools in Fylde. David Cam, DL would present the award and all nominees would receive a certificate.

The Mayor's Ball on Friday 23 March at Woodlands Suite, Ribby Hall.

5. Chief Executive's Communications

The Chief Executive provided instruction on how to use the new microphones.

6. Questions from Members of the Council

Decision Items

8. <u>Medium Term Financial Strategy Update, including General Fund, Capital Programme and Treasury</u> <u>Management for 2017/18 to 2021/22</u>

Councillor Susan Fazackerley, Leader of the Council, introduced the budget for 2018/19. She advised another year of sound financial management. She expressed how proud she was that the Council had gone from strength to strength in challenging circumstances whilst continuing to deliver quality services. She thanked members and officers for their diligence in contributing to the success of the council.

She commented that it was due to the vision and financial prudence of members and officers that had allowed the council to continue to support two swimming pools, a theatre and the refurbishment of the town hall including the new council chamber.

In concluding, Councillor Fazackerley gave her thanks to the Chief Financial Officer, Paul O'Donoghue and his team for their hard work in the production of the budget and the continuing good management of the council's finances, and Councillor Buckley and the Finance and Democracy Committee.

Councillor Karen Buckley, Chairman of Finance and Democracy Committee, started her presentation of the Medium Term Financial Strategy, with thanks to Paul O'Donoghue, Deputy Chief Financial Officer Paul Swindells and the finance team for their diligence and expertise, as well as the Senior Management Team, budget holders, officers of the council and members.

She advised that all the recommendations, with exception of the council tax resolution, had been considered in committee.

Councillor Buckley commented on the risks set out in the report, such as the revised New Homes Bonus policy; business rates retention had also been revised to 75% retention; and the Fair Funding review consultation was ongoing. Whilst the continuation of the Lancashire Business Rate Pool had been confirmed for the next 12 months but not yet for 2019/20. The employers' offer of a 2% staff pay award had not been accepted by the unions.

She advised that these outlined risk explained the approach for budget setting for 2018/19 and the recommendation to increase Council Tax by 2.99% which equated to an average Band D rise of £5.85 per annum.

Recommendations from committees had been considered including the proposed £20,000 contribution to the Community Projects Fund; public realm schemes in Ansdell, Kirkham and St Annes; a development scheme for Staining Playing Fields, and provision for arts storage.

Councillor Buckley provided an overview of the recommendations and the relevant related appendices which contained details of the budget proposals, the special expenses policy, fees and charges, the treasury management strategy, and council tax.

Councillor Buckley concluded her presentation by highlighting the Section 151 Officer's opinion that the Council's finances were in a robust position for the life of the forecast.

The proposal was moved by Councillor Buckley and seconded by Councillor Roger Small.

(Councillor Hayhurst entered the room during Councillor Buckley's presentation)

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Councillor Small, Councillor Nixon, Councillor Harvey, Councillor Redcliffe, Councillor Pitman and Councillor Little spoke in support of the proposed budget.

Councillor Nulty expressed concern over the levels of funds held in reserves.

Councillor Buckley summed up by offering reassurance regarding the level of reserves, which she stated were not comparatively excessive, and provided opportunities for investment, but also safeguarded the future of the council in light of future financial constraints.

In the absence of further debate on the budget, Councillor Silverwood, having indicated earlier, proposed an amendment which was seconded by Councillor Nulty. The amendment stated;

"For the purpose of our accounts being open and transparent, I propose once again, as last year, that the cost of the green waste service is accounted for separately in the accounts."

Following a debate, a recorded vote was taken and the amendment was LOST.

Abstentions (2) Councillor Brickles, Mulholland

As the amendment was lost, a further amendment was moved by Councillor Nulty, having indicated earlier her intention to move the same;

"The Arts Group be given a set of parameters to follow when discussing the future of the Fylde Art Collection, and any future decisions relating to the Arts Collection be fully debated by full council."

The amendment was seconded by Councillor Silverwood.

Following a debate, a recorded vote was taken and the amendment was LOST.

Votes for the proposal (3) – Councillors Clayton, Nulty and Silverwood.

The proposal was carried and it was thereby RESOLVED:

- 1. To approve and adopt the recommendations of the Finance and Democracy Committee as follows:
 - (a) The revised estimates for 2017/18 and the revenue budget for 2018/19 as set out in Appendix E, which includes recommended transfers to the Capital Investment Reserve in 2017/18 and 2018/19 equivalent to the balance of the revenue surplus for those years after allowing for all approved transfers to other reserves, currently estimated at £1.081m in 2017/18 and £0.844m in 2018/19;
 - (b) The budget proposals and changes to Reserves and Balances as set out in Appendices F & H;

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- (c) The updated Five Year Capital Programme as set out in Appendix G;
- (d) The updated Useable Reserves & Balances Policy as detailed in Appendix H;
- (e) An average Band D Council Tax of £201.61 for 2018/19 (excluding Town and Parish precepts), which is a 2.99% increase from the 2017/18 average Band D charge;
- (f) The Special Expenses policy as set out in Appendix I; which includes that:
 - for the purposes of charging special expenses, both the special expense costs and the tax bases relating to the areas of Lytham and St Annes will each be aggregated and the Council Tax charge per property at each band level will be the same across the whole area; and
 - the annual special expense charge per property will be set for 2018/19 at the 2017/18 level plus 3.06%, that being £73.97 per band D property; and
 - the annual borough wide charge per property will be set for 2018/19 at the 2017/18 level plus 3.06%, that being £157.66 per band D property; and
 - the budget resource to be allocated to delivering concurrent services and chargeable as special expenses for 2018/19 will be set at a sum equivalent to the annual special expense charge per property (band D equivalent) multiplied by the tax base for the special expense area;
- (g) The schedule of fees and charges for 2018/19 as detailed in Appendix J;
- (h) The Treasury Management Policy set out in Appendix K;
- (i) The Treasury Management Strategy set out in Appendix L, which incorporates the Minimum Revenue Provision Statement, the Council's Borrowing Strategy, Investment Strategy, and Treasury Prudential Indicators and Limits.

Council Tax Resolution

- 2. It be noted that the Section 151 Officer, under delegated authority, has on 11th December 2017 calculated:
 - (a) the Council Tax Base 2018/19 for the whole Council area as 29,751 [Item T in the formula in Section 31B of the Local Government Finance Act 1992, as amended (the "Act")]; and
 - (b) a Council Tax Base, for dwellings in those parts of its area to which a Parish/Neighbourhood precept relates, as indicated below:
